eLearning Days Plan 2025-2026

Langston Charter Middle School has been approved by the South Carolina Department of Education to operate as an eLearning school. This designation permits the school to implement eLearning when closures occur due to weather-related events. These eLearning days are not counted against the school calendar and do not require make-up days. The information below outlines key details about eLearning days.

Expectations:

On asynchronous eLearning days, students are expected to take an active role in their learning by checking for assignments daily on Google Classroom, their teachers designated platform. A minimum of 200 minutes of daily instruction will be provided, and students are responsible for completing all assigned work and submitting it by the deadlines set by each teacher. Students must complete their own work and always uphold academic integrity. Incomplete work will not receive credit, and students who do not complete their assignments within five school days will be marked absent for the eLearning day. Exceptions may be granted in cases of extenuating circumstances. Teachers will respond to all emails and messages received during working hours of the instructional day before the end of the workday. Students should also stay informed by regularly checking their email, the school website, and weekly bulletins for important updates and class information.

Schedule:

eLearning days are asynchronous, allowing students to complete their work at their own pace within the designated instructional day. In accordance with state law, an instructional day must include a minimum of 5.5 hours or at least 200 minutes of daily instruction. Teachers are expected to provide instructional content that meets this requirement, with their availability aligning with the 5.5-hour instructional window. Teachers will be available to meet with students from 8:30 AM to 2:00 PM to offer support, answer questions, and provide guidance throughout the eLearning day.

Communication:

The eLearning plan will be communicated through the school's website, email, and weekly bulletins. Students may contact their teachers via email, with addresses available on the school's website at <u>https://langstoncharter.org/staff/</u>.

Troubleshooting:

Students should first reach out to their teachers if they experience issues with devices, applications, or any other technical difficulties. Teachers can be contacted via email, and their email addresses are available on the school website at https://langstoncharter.org/staff/. If the issue cannot be resolved by the teacher, administrators will be accessible by email to provide additional support. In cases where the problem cannot be resolved remotely, students will be granted additional time to complete their assignments upon returning to school.
