Position Overview:

We are seeking a dedicated and passionate Spanish Teacher to join our team at Langston Charter Middle School. The Spanish Teacher will provide instruction to students in grades 6, 7, and 8. Instruction in grades 6 and 7 will focus on developing foundational language skills and preparing students for Spanish I. Students in 8th grade will complete Spanish I and earn high school credit upon successful completion of the course.

The ideal candidate will have a strong background in Spanish language instruction, excellent communication skills, and a genuine desire to inspire and motivate students to develop proficiency in Spanish and an appreciation for Hispanic cultures.

Responsibilities:

1. Design and implement a comprehensive Spanish curriculum for grades 6–8 aligned with state standards, high school credit requirements, and the school's mission.
2. Develop and refine Pre-Spanish I curriculum for grades 6 and 7 to ensure students are fully prepared for success in the Spanish I high school credit course in grade 8.
3. Plan, prepare, and deliver engaging, standards-based lessons that promote listening, speaking, reading, and writing proficiency in Spanish.
4. Foster a positive and inclusive classroom environment that promotes language acquisition, cultural awareness, and active student participation.
5. Utilize a variety of instructional strategies, authentic resources, and technology tools to enhance student learning and promote real-world application of the Spanish language.
6. Assess and evaluate student progress through formative and summative assessments aligned to proficiency standards and Spanish I high school credit expectations.

5. Demonstrated ability to develop curriculum and instructional materials that prepare students for high school-level coursework.
6. Excellent communication and interpersonal skills, with the ability to build positive relationships with students, parents, and colleagues.
7. Demonstrated ability to effectively manage a classroom and foster an engaging language-learning environment.
8. Proficiency in spoken and written Spanish.
